## 2020 Maine Science Festival – celebrating the Bicentennial and Maine Science

BANGOR, ME – The 6<sup>th</sup> Maine Science Festival (MSF) is back with more than 70 events and activities for *all ages* over 5 days. In the year when we celebrate our Bicentennial, the 2020 Maine Science Festival's headliner event, sponsored by Emera Maine, is an all-Maine event: the world premiere of *The Warming Sea*, a symphonic exploration of hope in the face of climate change. The MSF commissioned GRAMMY award winner Lucas Richman to write *The Warming Sea*, and it is part of the Bangor Symphony Orchestra's March 22, 2020 concert (Masterworks IV: Sounds of the Sea). It is also a Maine Bicentennial event.

The MSF is also continuing its longtime partnership and collaboration with <u>Penobscot Theatre Company</u>. This year, Penobscot Theatre Company is presenting the play <u>Safety Net</u> by Daryl Lisa Fazio (March 13-29th) and the MSF is working with them and providing a series of discussions as part of the full run of the show: 12 pre-talk conversations and 4 post-play talk-backs (after the matinees).

Beyond the arts partnerships, this year's MSF again shows the wide variety of the science expertise in Maine. Over the five days, sessions will cover the science of climate change, dogs, space, aquaculture, history, economics, addiction, sound, sleep, renewable energy, virtual and augmented reality, and more. There is no better way to learn about Maine science.

"The MSF is a chance to not only learn from some of the best Maine has to offer, but also to celebrate them and their work," says MSF Founder and Director Kate Dickerson. "And partnering with arts organizations allows the scientists, researchers, and practitioners in Maine the opportunity to reach an entirely different audience than who they usually reach. I think that's a perfect representation of what the Maine Science Festival is all about."

While all events other than the headliner are free of charge thanks to the support of <u>MSF Sponsors</u>, there is a suggested donation of \$5. Dickerson explained, "Many science festivals around the country charge anywhere from \$10-30 for just one event like Tech Night or 5 Minute Genius. The MSF doesn't, but we hope to get some donations from festival-goers who can afford it. That way we can make sure that everyone has the opportunity to learn about Maine's world and national leading researchers."

All MSF events other than MSF Science Trivia Nights and the world premiere of *The Warming Sea* will take place in Bangor. On Saturday, March 16th, there will be events both at the Cross Insurance Center and at locations throughout Downtown Bangor. On all other days of the MSF, the events will be held in Downtown Bangor.
